What subjects should my daughter choose for Year 3?

Find out the various subject combinations available

As a parent, take your time to understand the various subject combinations available to your daughter.

"I was pretty clueless last year when my daughter had to select her subject combination. I was glad the school gave valuable advice through Zoom," shared a Year 3 parent.

shared a Year 3 mum. Another factor that shows your daughter's strengths would be

her Year 2 examination results.

"For me, it is best to go with my daughter's ability," said a Year 4 parent. "After all, the school does not have a quota for the subject combinations. The students do not need to fight for a slot for the combination that they want."

Have a discussion with your daughter

After your daughter presented you with the list of subject combinations, do have a discussion with her. Find out her interests and which subjects she is comfortable taking.

Some points for discussion include pros and cons of choosing each combination based on her interests, specific career paths she would like to take, and also her academic excellence in the specific subjects.

"If your daughter is unsure about her career choice at this point in time, it is good to keep the subject combination as versatile as possible. This will allow her more choices when it comes to choosing courses in University," advised a Year 4 mum.

Ask the seniors

Encourage your daughter to speak to her seniors who are taking the same subject combination that your daughter is considering. They would be able to give the pros and cons of the subjects and share some tips on how to cope.
